# **GRANTS**

Jaya Satagopan was awarded an NCI R01 grant: "Study of exposures and biomarkers in cancer epidemiology." This project develops statistical and algorithmic tools to build parsimonious risk models for obtaining insights into gene-exposure interactions and the benefits of exposure reduction in clinical epidemiology studies measuring multiple outcomes, longitudinally measured exposures, and high-dimensional genetic data. This is a collaboration with MSK colleagues - Christine Zhou and Drs. Irene Orlow, Allan Halpern, Denise Correa, Tim Ahles – and the University of Michigan.

#### STAFF ACHIEVEMENT

Our department hosted a NIH-funded symposium on "Statistical and Computational Methods for Pharmacogenetic Epidemiology of Cancer" on August 11 and 12, 2016. This is the second symposium co-organized with MD Anderson Cancer Center's Department of Biostatistics. There were over 80 registered participants and 19 talks given by established and emerging leaders in the field.
